

Provisioning Support

Provisioning support is the action taken to facilitate the best selection, procurement, and cataloging of items of supply required to sustain weapon systems and other government requirements. When a new weapon system is identified, a data call is put out to all areas requesting their needs and requirements to support this system. DLIS-KAE will:

- Prepare the cataloging portions of the data call for inclusion in the Contract Data Requirements List (CDRL)
- Prepare the Statement of Work (SOW)
- Attend provisioning conferences and in-process reviews
- Validate technical data
- Recommend approved item names
- Develop a provisioning tool spreadsheet that can also be furnished as a compact disc (CD). The Integrated Provisioning Data Support Process (IPDSP) stores tech data in electronic format and includes all research documented by DLIS technicians. Research is performed on all part numbers submitted by the contractor. The documented research consists of part number data, NSN data, and CAGE code data. Item entry control, a filtering process which scrutinizes potential candidates for inclusion in the federal catalog, is performed and technicians make recommendations for substitutable items.
